5th Sunday of Ordinary Time/B 4th February 2024

Gospel Reading Mark 1:29-39

Today we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, learning more about the ministry of Jesus. Jesus cured Simon's mother-in-law, and she immediately began to serve Jesus and his disciples. Jesus also cured many others who were brought to him, healing their illnesses and driving out demons. As we will see throughout Mark's Gospel, Jesus did not permit the demons to speak because they knew his identity and would have revealed it to those who were present.

On the morning after this busy day, Jesus retreated in prayer, but was pursued by Simon and others who brought news that many people were looking for him. At this point in Mark's Gospel, we begin to see a distinct role for the inner circle of Jesus' disciples—they act as intermediaries between Jesus and the people. Jesus reports to his disciples that they need to leave Capernaum to preach in other places.

Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee.

Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

In today's Gospel we also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found guidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives.

Catechist Sunday (10/11 February 2024)



Have you ever considered becoming a Catechist but you weren't sure of what that entails? Here are a few answers to the most asked questions about becoming a catechist in our local state primary schools.

What is involved?

As a catechist, you are invited by the Church to share our faith with children and teens in public schools by giving time each week during the school term for lesson preparation and teaching.

What do I need?

A willingness to share your faith life.

A Working With Children Check (WWCC) which we can help you apply for.

What help will I get?

Support and encouragement from our catechist group who share your faith interests and goals.

CCD provides practical training courses including compulsory safeguarding training to help you to develop teaching skills and to make the best use of your own gifts.

- A Teacher's Manual containing easy to follow lesson plans.
- Student Activity Books for each child.
- Resources to help you and the students enjoy interesting and creative lessons.

Catechists who are willing to help in our public schools teach children about God and His love for all. Jesus always picked those willing to follow his way by "making the willing able". Please know that we do not expect you to teach as soon as you begin. You can start as a helper. A helper assists a Catechist in class and is not required to give a lesson; then, when you feel ready and have begun training you may like to start to prepare lessons and teach.

If you would like more information about the mission of a Catechist or Helper, please contact CCD Sydney or our Parish Catechist Coordinator, Yvonne Vitagliani.

Please note that next weekend on Catechist Sunday (10/11 February), at every mass, those who have answered the call to be Catechists in our local primary state schools, will celebrate the Rite of Commitment and Sending Forth.


