Luke 1:1-14 (CEV)

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

Emperor Augustus gave orders for the names of all the people
to be listed in record books.

These first records were made when Quirinius was governor of Syria.
Everyone had to go to their own hometown to be listed.
So Joseph had to leave Nazareth in Galilee
and go to Bethlehem in Judea.

Long ago Bethlehem had been King David's hometown,
and Joseph went there because he was from David's family.
Mary was engaged to Joseph and travelled with him to Bethlehem.
She was soon going to have a baby,
and while they were there,
she gave birth to her first-born Son.

She dressed him in baby clothes and laid him in a manger,
because there was no room for them in the inn.
That night in the fields near Bethlehem
some shepherds were guarding their sheep.
